Dear Tenant,

Housing Works currently has the minimum rent policy of \$50 for all participants. Per your request for a Hardship Exemption, we must determine your eligibility for this request. You may apply for this exemption if one of following financial hardships situations occurs:

- 1) The family has lost eligibility for or is awaiting an eligibility determination for a federal, state, or local assistance program. For a family waiting for a determination of eligibility, the hardship period will end as of the first of the month following 1) implementation of assistance, if approved, or 2) the decision to deny assistance.
- 2) The family would be evicted because it is unable to pay the minimum rent.
- 3) Family income has decreased because of changed family circumstances, including the loss of employment.
- 4) A death has occurred in the family.
- 5) The family has experienced other circumstances determined by Housing Works.

When you request a hardship exemption, Housing Works must suspend the minimum rent requirement beginning the first of the month following your request. Housing Works then determines whether the hardship exemption exists and whether the hardship is temporary or long-term.

If you are NOT eligible

If Housing Works determines there is no financial hardship, Housing Works will reinstate the minimum rent and require you to repay the amounts suspended.

If the Hardship Exemption is Temporary (less than 90 days)

At the end of the 90-day suspension period, the family must resume payment of the minimum rent and must repay Housing Works the amounts suspended. Housing Works will negotiate a reasonable repayment agreement.

If the Hardship Exemption is LONG TERM (90 days or more)

Housing Works must exempt the family from the minimum rent requirements for as long as the hardship continues.
